mLINQS AND INTERSTATE FORM PARTNERSHIP FOR GOVERNMENT RELOCATION INITIATIVE

FAIRFAX, VA – (December 13, 2004) – mLINQS[™], LLC and Interstate Worldwide Relocation today jointly announced that the two companies have entered into a partnership to provide federal agencies with a hosted (ASP) version of the mLINQS Relocation Management Reporting System. According to terms of the agreement, Interstate will host and maintain the system on its existing secure government servers. mLINQS will provide application enhancements and customer support for implementation, and both companies will cross-market their existing relocation related services to federal customers.

"This partnership enables mLINQS to take a major step forward to provide a comprehensive Relocation Management Reporting System as defined recently by the General Services Administration (GSA)," said Greg McIntyre, mLINQS President. The mLINQS reporting system complements our existing relocation move management service, which we provide to both civilian agencies and DoD. With the eTravel Service (eTS) soon to be ubiquitous in civilian agencies and the Defense Travel System (DTS) being implemented throughout the Department of Defense (DoD), total automation of relocation management is the last remaining initiative to close the loop on all aspects of eTravel in government. GSA issued a proposed rule for the federal relocation management program on November 23, 2004 that requires agencies to have a Relocation Management Reporting System in place by September 30, 2005. DoD has already begun evaluating a number of opportunities to improve its relocation management.
