mLINQS Government Relocation User Group Draws Federal Managers to Discuss System Advancements, Future Requirements

FAIRFAX, VA – (February 9, 2009) – mLINQS, LLC today announced that the company's User Group meeting, held February 3 in Alexandria, Virginia, was attended by government relocation managers representing programs that process moves nationally and internationally for more than 30 federal agencies. This event provided agencies with a forum to discuss the way government manages relocation, and to shape future releases of the company's moveLINQ® relocation expense management system. moveLINQ, introduced in 2004, is the first and only fully functional relocation system of its kind developed exclusively for use by federal agencies.

Opening the working session was Debbie Bicer, mLINQS director of product development, who presented an overview of the company's plans for the next release of moveLINQ, scheduled for mid-2009. This release, incorporating significant customer input, will further expand incorporation of "wizards" to enhance user experience, and provide management with more comprehensive sets of controls to speed processing and expand the system's ability to generate data for cost reporting.

"The high degree of product satisfaction expressed by our customers during the user group was very gratifying," said mLINQS President, Greg McIntyre. "Adhering to complex federal regulations and producing usable data on costs is our challenge. By having a core of relocation management experts in attendance at these events, we keep our moveLINQ system ahead of the curve. The result is a unique software offering that more efficiently, effectively and transparently helps federal agencies to manage their relocation programs in the real world."

Michael Wong, the company's director of product management, led a roundtable discussion following the product overview. This discussion included topics of universal customer concerns surrounding existing federal relocation regulations and tax rules, as well as their diverse opinions and interpretation of policy and how subsequent releases of moveLINQ should be enhanced to manage anticipated future challenges.

The session concluded with a presentation provided by the General Services Administration (GSA), Office of Governmentwide Policy. It included a review of what are predicted to be significant changes to the Federal Travel Regulation (FTR), scheduled for publication within the next 90 days, and the existing GSA legislative package currently before Congress.

Changes to the FTR will likely reinforce a requirement that all agencies collect and report relocation cost data to GSA and the Office of Management and Budget. The FTR is also expected to define a comprehensive, automated relocation management system, which GSA has been encouraging agencies to adopt.

mLINQS has long supported the relocation data consolidation and centralized management efforts of GSA. "We developed our relocation expense management system to fully align with GSA's objectives," said McIntyre. "Our growth in market share clearly indicates we're on track to help agencies fully comply with federal regulations, while enabling them to enforce the policies that support their individual goals."
